VIRGINIA RETURNS TO PRESEASON AP RANKINGS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2001-02

- UVa is ranked No. 24 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll.
- The preseason AP top 25 ranking is Virginia's first since being ranked No. 11 to start the 2001-02 season.
- The Cavaliers also return to the rankings for the first time since Feb. 27, 2012, when they were No. 24 in AP poll.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVa sports an 8-0 all-time mark, including a 5-0 mark in Charlottesville, against James Madison in the series that dates back to 1977-78.
-The Cavaliers host James Madison for the first time at John Paul Jones Arena.


## AGAINST THE CAA

- James Madison is the lone Colonial Athletic Association opponent on Virginia's 2013-14 schedule.
- Virginia went 0-3 against the CAA last season, dropping games to George Mason (63-59), Delaware (59-53) and Old Dominion (63-61).
- UVa is $84-30$ all-time against current CAA members (1-0 vs. Charleston, $10-2$ vs. Delaware, 2-0 vs. Drexel, 1-2 vs. Hofstra, 8-0 vs. James

Madison, 3-0 vs. UNCW, 1-0 vs. Northeastern, 5-0 vs. Towson and 53-26 vs. William \& Mary).
AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 45-12 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- UVa is 11-3 in its last 14 games vs. in-state opponents.
-The Cavaliers went 3-2 against in-state teams last season, defeating Virginia Tech twice (74-58 \& 73-55) and Norfolk State (67-56) and losing to George Mason (63-59) and Old Dominion (63-61).

## VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett enters his fifth season at UVa with a 76-53 mark in Charlottesville and 145-86 record in seven seasons of coaching.
- Bennett guided the Cavaliers to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and NIT in 2013.
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last four seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12 and 23 in 2013-13).
- UVa's 11 ACC wins in 2012-13 were its most since 11 in 2006-07.
- Bennett is one of 23 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.


## ABOUT THE 2013-14 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the preseason polls (Duke, Syracuse, North Carolina, VCU, Wisconsin and Notre Dame), while three (Tennessee, Pittsburgh and Boston College) are receiving votes.
-Twelve opponents (JMU, VCU, Davidson, Liberty, Wisconsin, NC State, Duke, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Notre Dame, Miami and Syracuse) earned 2013 NCAA Tournament berths, while four (Norfolk State, Tennessee, Florida State and Maryland) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Northern lowa and Green Bay) in the Collegelnsider.com Tournament.


## VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

-Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball.
-The Cavaliers, who were picked seventh and finished tied for fourth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last four seasons.

- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by Syracuse, North Carolina, UVa, Notre Dame, Pitt, Maryland, Boston College, Florida State, NC State, Georgia Tech, Miami, Wake Forest, Clemson and Virginia Tech.


## EMBRACE THE PACE

- In 2012-13, the Cavaliers ranked in the top 16 nationally in six defensive categories: points per game (5th), assists per game (7th), points per possession (12th), possessions per 40 minutes (15th), fouls per game (15th) and field goal percentage (16th).
- The Cavaliers held 26 of their 35 opponents under 60 points.
- UVa held its ACC opponents under 60 points in 14 of 18 games.
- UVa held eight opponents under 50 points last season.
- UVa held four opponents (Tennessee, Mississippi Valley State, Wofford and Florida State) under 40 points.
- UVa held its opponent under 43 percent shooting from the field in 22 of 35 games.


## HARRIS AND MITCHELL LEAD CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Senior Joe Harris and Akil Mitchell lead the Cavaliers into action this season.
- Last season, Harris averaged a career-high 16.3 points and Mitchell added career bests with 13.1 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.
- Harris tallied a career-high 36 points against Duke and Mitchell had a team-leading 12 double-doubles.
- Harris earned All-ACC first-team honors, while Mitchell was named to the third team.
- Harris ranks 27th on UVa's all-time scoring list with 1,255 points and Mitchell has grabbed 539 career rebounds.


## BROGDON RETURNS TO ACTION

- Redshirt sophomore guard Malcolm Brogdon returns to action after missing the 2012-13 season and last four games of 2011-12 with a foot injury.
- Brogdon averaged 6.7 points in 28 games as a freshman in 2011-12.


## GILL TO MAKE VIRGINIA DEBUT

- Redshirt sophomore transfer Anthony Gill makes his Virginia debut after sitting out last season after transferring from South Carolina.
- Gill averaged 7.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a freshman for South Carolina in 2011-12.
- He was the high school teammate of Akil Mitchell at Charlotte Christian High School in 2009-10.


## ANDERSON ACCOMPLISHES RARE FEAT

- Sophomore Justin Anderson was one of two players in NCAA Divison I to record 20 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in a game last season, joining South Alabama's Mychal Ammons who also accomplished the rare feat.
- Anderson tallied 24 points, six rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in Virginia's season-ending 75-64 loss to lowa, while Ammons had 21 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers vs. FIU.
- Anderson led Virginia in scoring during the NIT, averaging 19 points in three contests.
- He earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors on Feb. 11, 2013, after averaging 15.5 points, five rebounds and 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals in a pair of wins.


## PERRANTES AND HALL HIGHLIGHT NEWCOMERS

- Freshman recruits London Perrantes and Devon Hall highlight a list of five newcomers this season.
- As high school seniors, Perrantes averaged 19.9 points and 5.8 assists per game for Crespi Carmelite High School, while Hall averaged 13.7 points, seven rebounds and eight assists for Cape Henry Collegiate.
- Walk-ons Maleek Frazier, Jeff Jones and Rob Vozenilek round out the 16-man roster.
- Jones is the son of former UVa player and head coach and current Old Dominion head coach Jeff Jones.
- Vozenilek, who was a member of the men's basketball team in 2011-12, is the brother of UVa football kicker and punter Alec Vozenilek.

## THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Virginia went 20-2 at John Paul Jones Arena, setting a school record for home wins in a season.
- UVa's 19-game home winning streak marked a JPJ record and was its longest home winning streak since the schoolrecord 34-game home winning streak from 1980-83 at University Hall.
- The Cavaliers concluded the 2013 ACC season with a 9-0 home record, marking the fourth time in school history they have gone undefeated at home during ACC action (1981, 1982, 2007 and 2013).
- Virginia is 93-33 (.728) in seven seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- Virginia is 55-17 (.764) at home under head coach Tony Bennett.

- All games will be broadcast on the Virginia Sports Radio Network with Dave Koehn (play-by-play) and Ted Jeffries (analyst) calling the action.


## ON THE HORIZON

- Virginia hosts VCU in non-conference action on Tuesday, Nov. 12. The meeting is Virginia's first against VCU since an 86-70 win over the Rams on Nov. 13, 1998.

PRESS CREDENTIALS

Media members interested in obtaining season or game credentials should contact Erich Bacher via email at bacher@virginia.edu, office phone (434) 982-5530 or cell phone (720) 318-5538. We would like to receive credential requests no later than seven (7) days prior to the game. Credentials that can't be mailed will be held for pickup at the will call window at John Paul Jones Arena. You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

## PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

## PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

## INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

## POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

## RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew.
