FOR OPENERS

- Virginia meets Navy for the first time since Feb. 16, 1974, when the Cavaliers beat the Midshipmen, 91-72.
- UVa is 45-19 against non-conference opponents during the Tony Bennett era.
- The Cavaliers rank fifth nationally in scoring defense at 52.3 points per game.
- Virginia has had a different scoring leader in each of its first three games (Anthony Gill, Joe Harris and Mike Tobey).

VIRGINIA RECEIVING VOTES IN LATEST NATIONAL POLLS

- UVa received votes in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.
- Virginia's No. 24 preseason AP ranking marked its first since being ranked No. 11 to start the 2001-02 season.
- The Cavaliers, who were ranked for two weeks, returned to the rankings this season for the first time since Feb. 27, 2012, when they were No. 24 in the AP poll.

SERIES HISTORY

- Navy leads Virginia, 31-13, in the all-time series that dates back to 1909-10.
- UVa has a six-game winning streak against Navy.
- The Cavaliers are 5-1 against Navy in Charlottesville and are meeting for the first time at John Paul Jones Arena.

AGAINST THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

- Navy is the lone Patriot League opponent on Virginia's 2013-14 schedule.
- Virginia is 33-34 record against current Patriot League members (13-31 vs. Navy, 7-0 vs. Loyola, 5-1 vs. American, 3-0 vs. Army, 2-1 vs. Lafayette, 2-1 vs. Bucknell and 1-0 vs. Lehigh).

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia posted a 70-57 win over Davidson on Nov. 16 at Time Warner Cable Arena in Charlotte, N.C.
- Malcolm Brogdon had a career-high 17 points and Mike Tobey added a season-high 18 points to lead Virginia.
- Justin Anderson added 12 points and Akil Mitchell had 11 as the Cavaliers outscored Davidson, 36-8, in the paint.
- Mitchell added a season-high nine rebounds as UVa outrebounded (42-30) its opponent for the third straight game.
- UVa shot 52.1 percent (25-of-48) from the floor and a season-high 76.2 percent (16-of-21) from the charity stripe.

HARRIS AND MITCHELL LEAD CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Returning All-ACC members Joe Harris and Akil Mitchell lead the Cavaliers into action this season.
- Last season, Harris averaged a career-high 16.3 points and Mitchell added career bests with 13.1 points and 8.9 rebounds per game.
- Harris tallied a career-high 36 points against Duke and Mitchell had a team-leading 12 double-doubles.
- Harris earned All-ACC first-team honors, while Mitchell was named to the third team.
- Harris ranks 27th on UVa's all-time scoring list with 1,279 points and Mitchell has grabbed 553 career rebounds.
- In 2013-14, Harris is averaging eight points per game, while Mitchell is averaging nine points.
- Harris was held to just one point vs. Davidson (11/16/13), marking his second lowest point in 101 career games at UVa. Harris was held scoreless in a 49-47 win over Clemson on Feb. 2, 2011 during his freshman season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has a 78-54 mark in five seasons at UVA and 147-87 record in eight seasons of coaching.
- Bennett guided the Cavaliers to the NCAA Tournament in 2012 and NIT in 2013.
- Bennett has increased UVA's win total in each of the last four seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12 and 23 in 2013-13).
- UVA's 11 ACC wins in 2012-13 were its most since 11 in 2006-07.
- Bennett is one of 23 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- The Cavaliers rank in the top 20 nationally in four defensive categories: points per game (5th), points per possession (16th), rebound percentage (18th) and possessions per 40 minutes (19th).
- Virginia has held all three of its opponents below 42 percent shooting from the floor and opponents are shooting just 24.3 percent (9-of-37) from 3-point range.
- Virginia has limited JMU (2), VCU (3) and Davidson (2) to a combined seven fast break points.

CLEANING THE GLASS

- Virginia has outrebounded its opponents in each of its first three games.
- The Cavaliers rank 18th nationally in rebound percentage at 58.5 percent and are enjoying a +14.3 average rebound margin per game.
- Darion Atkins (7.7), Mike Tobey (6.3), Malcolm Brogdon (6.0), Joe Harris (5.3), Akil Mitchell (4.7) and Justin Anderson (4.7) are each averaging four or more rebounds per game.

MALCOLM BACK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ACTION

- Redshirt sophomore guard Malcolm Brogdon returned to action against JMU (11/8/13) after missing the 2012-13 season and last four games of 2011-12 with a foot injury.
- Brogdon is averaging a team-leading 12 points and 1.7 steals per game.
- Brogdon is shooting 54.2 percent (13-of-24) from the floor and 66.7 percent (4-of-6) from 3-point range.
- Brogdon tallied a career-high 17 points vs. Davidson (11/16/13) and matched his career high with three 3-pointers against JMU (11/8/13).
- He averaged 6.7 points in 28 games as a freshman in 2011-12.

TOBEY, TOBEY, TOBEY...FEELS GOOD

- Mike Tobey is becoming Virginia's go-to man, averaging career bests in points (11), rebounds (6) and blocks (1.3) this season.
- Tobey is also displaying his scoring touch, shooting 62.5 percent (15-of-24) from the floor and 75 percent (3-of-4) from the free-throw line.
- He tallied a season 18 points vs. Davidson (11/16/13) and had a career-high nine rebounds vs. VCU (11/12/13).

AG MAKES UVA DEBUT

- Redshirt sophomore transfer Anthony Gill made his long-awaited Virginia debut against JMU (11/8/13) after sitting out last season as a transfer from South Carolina.
- Gill tallied a team-leading 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting in 20 minutes against JMU (11/8/13).
- He is averaging 6.0 points and 2.3 rebounds for UVA this season.
- Gill averaged 7.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a freshman for South Carolina in 2011-12.

CARRY ON DARION

- Junior forward Darion Atkins is averaging 5.3 points and a team-leading 7.7 rebounds per game.
- Atkins matched a career high with 11 rebounds vs. JMU (11/8/13) and has two blocked shots and two steals this season.

ANDERSON ACCOMPLISHES RARE FEAT

- Sophomore Justin Anderson was one of two players in NCAA Division I to record 20 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in a game last season, joining South Alabama's Mychal Ammons who also accomplished the rare feat.
- Anderson tallied 24 points, six rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers in Virginia's season-ending 75-64 loss to Iowa (3/27/13), while Ammons had 21 points, five rebounds, five blocked shots and five 3-pointers vs. FIU.
- Anderson started the first two games and had 12 points and eight rebounds off the bench vs. Davidson (11/16/13).

LONDON CALLING

- Freshman London Perrantes has quickly joined the UVA starting lineup, making his first collegiate start in UVA's third game vs. Davidson (11/16/13).
- Perrantes is averaging 3.0 points, 2.7 rebounds and a team-leading 2.3 assists in 27.7 minutes per game.
- Perrantes had five points, five assists and no turnovers in a team-high 32 minutes vs. Davidson.

STITH, WILKINS AND SALT INK LETTERS OF INTENT WITH CAVALIERS

- Tony Bennett announced the signings of center Jack Salt (Auckland, New Zealand/Westlake Boys High School), guard B.J. Stith (Lawrenceville, Va./Oak Hill Academy) and forward Isaiah Wilkins (Lilburn, Ga./Greater Atlanta Christian School) to National Letters of Intent.
- The 6-10, 240-pound Salt tallied 14 points and 16 rebounds as the Westlake Boys High School Premier Team recently defended its New Zealand School Boys AA title.
- The 6-5, 205-pound Stith helped lead Brunswick High School to three straight Virginia High School League Division 3 State titles prior to enrolling at Oak Hill Academy for the 2013-14 season. Stith was named all-state and all-region after averaging 16 points, six rebounds and six assists per game to lead the 2013 state champion Bulldogs. Stith, who is ranked No. 48 on Rivals.com's 2014 Prospect Ranking list, is the son of former Virginia star and NBA player Bryant Stith.
- The 6-8, 205-pound Wilkins averaged 17 points and eight rebounds per game for Greater Atlanta Christian School in 2012-13. Wilkins led Greater Christian to the Georgia AA State championship and was named the AA State Player of the Year and Region 6-AA Player of the Year.

ABOUT THE 2013-14 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents were ranked in the preseason polls (Duke, Syracuse, North Carolina, VCU, Wisconsin and Notre Dame), while three (Tennessee, Pittsburgh and Boston College) received votes.

2013-14 Opponents in Bold

• Twelve opponents (JMU, VCU, Davidson, Liberty, Wisconsin, NC State, Duke, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Notre Dame, Miami and Syracuse) earned 2013 NCAA Tournament berths, while four (Norfolk State, Tennessee, Florida State and Maryland) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Northern Iowa and Green Bay) in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked seventh and finished tied for fourth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last four seasons.
- Duke is the preseason favorite, followed by Syracuse, North Carolina, UVa, Notre Dame, Pitt, Maryland, Boston College, Florida State, NC State, Georgia Tech, Miami, Wake Forest, Clemson and Virginia Tech.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is 7-14 against ranked opponents, including a 1-6 mark vs. top five opponents, in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 122-310 vs. ranked opponents, including a 24-119 mark against top-5 foes, since 1953-54.
- The Cavaliers are 1-26 vs. No. 1-ranked opponents (86-73 vs. No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 30, 1986).
- The Cavaliers are 0-1 vs. ranked opponents this season, losing 59-56 to No. 14 VCU.

HARRIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

- Joe Harris is one of five players named Preseason All-ACC.
- Joining Harris on the preseason All-ACC team were C.J. Fair (Syracuse), Rodney Hood (Duke), Jabari Parker (Duke) and Jerian Grant (Notre Dame).
- Fair was the pick for Preseason ACC Player of the Year and Parker was named Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year.

HARRIS ONE OF 15 ON ROBERTSON WATCH LIST

- Joe Harris is one of 15 players on the preseason Oscar Robertson Watch List, honoring the nation's NCAA Division I Player of the Year.
- Joining Harris on the Robertson watch list were Jahii Carson (Arizona State), Aaron Craft (Ohio State), C. J. Fair (Syracuse), Aaron Gordon (Arizona), Gary Harris (Michigan State), Doug McDermott (Creighton), Mitch McGary (Michigan), Shabazz Napier (Connecticut), Jabari Parker (Duke), Adreian Payne (Michigan State), Julius Randle (Kentucky), Marcus Smart (Oklahoma State), Russ Smith (Louisville) and Andrew Wiggins (Kansas).

HARRIS A WOODEN AWARD CANDIDATE

- Joe Harris is one of 50 players on the preseason John R. Wooden Award list.
- Created in 1976, the John R. Wooden Award is the most prestigious individual honor in college basketball.
- It is bestowed upon the nation's best player at an institution of higher education who has proven to his or her university that he or she is making progress toward graduation and maintaining a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA.
- Previous winners include such notables as Larry Bird ('79), Michael Jordan ('84), Tim Duncan ('97) and Kevin Durant ('09).

TOBEY AND BENNETT STRIKE GOLD

- Mike Tobey and Tony Bennett helped Team USA to the gold medal at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship in Prague, Czech Republic this summer.
- Tobey averaged 4.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game as the Americans finished a perfect 9-0 in the tournament.
- Bennett served as an assistant coach under Florida and USA head coach Billy Donovan.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena.
